 (ii) Neoclassical period, 1920–1951: Music inspired by 18th-century music such as those by Mozart. He wrote for smaller groups of musicians. For example, Pulcinella

(iii) Serial period, after 1951: He started to write music based on the twelve-tone system. For example, Canticum sacrum
